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After his Ph.D, he spent two years at the CAIP Center, Rutgers University, Piscataway, NJ, in the speech processing group of Prof. J. Flanagan, where he explored innovative approaches for speech production. Between 1997 and 2001, he successively worked for Matra Nortel Communications, Bois d'Arcy, France, and for Philips Consumer Communications, Montrouge, France. In particular, he was the project manager of several large-scale European projects in the field of audio and multimodal signal processing.

In September 2001, he joined the Department of Signal and Image Processing, GET-Télécom Paris (ENST), where he is now full Professor in audio signal processing and Head of the Audio, Acoustics and Waves research group. He is co-author of over 70 papers and inventor in a number of patents, he is also one of the expert of the European commission in the field of audio signal processing and man/machine interfaces. Pr. Richard is a member of the EURASIP, senior member of IEEE and Associate Editor of the IEEE Transactions on Audio, Speech and Language Processing.
